AIA Document A107™–2007 establishes the agreement between an Owner and Contractor for construction projects of a limited scope. A107–2007 is a stand-alone agreement because it contains its own internal general conditions and does not require the addition of a separate general conditions document.

Document A107 – 2007

AIA Document A107™–2007 is a stand-alone agreement with its own internal general conditions and is intended for use on construction projects of limited scope. It is intended for use on medium-to-large sized projects where payment is based on either a stipulated sum or the cost of the work plus a fee, with or without a guaranteed maximum price.

AIA A104™–2017 is a stand-alone agreement with its own internal general conditions and is intended for use on construction projects of limited scope and complexity. The AIA A104 replaces AIA Document A107™–2007, Standard Form of Agreement Between Owner and Contractor for a Project of Limited Scope.

A104- 2017 (formerly A107-2007) Owner-Contractor Agreement

AIA Document A104—2017 is an updated version of, and has replaced, AIA Document A107—2017. The new document better reflects its intended use and its coordination with AIA Document B104—2017, Standard Abbreviated Form of Agreement Between Owner and Architect.

Main differences between A104™–2017 and A107™–2007

AIA Document A104-2017 is a stand-alone agreement with its own internal general conditions and is intended for use on construction projects of limited scope and complexity. A104-2017 replaces AIA Document A107-2007, Standard Form of Agreement Between Owner and Contractor for a Project of Limited Scope.
