Establish a Head Lice Control Standard Communicate your policy to your staff and teach them how to properly identify head lice and nits (lice eggs). ## **Child Care Provider's Guide To Controlling Head Lice ...**

Diagnosis. According to the American Academy of Pediatrics guidelines, the gold standard for diagnosing an active head-lice infestation is the identification of a live nymph or adult louse. These guidelines recommend an examination of wet hair lubricated with such products as a standard hair conditioner. Your doctor will carefully comb your child's hair with a fine-toothed comb (nit comb) from the scalp to the end of the hair.

However, head lice infection is most common amongst children and this guidance is intended to offer advice to health, education and social work professionals on managing head lice infection in schools and other child care settings such as hospitals, nurseries, out of school clubs and residential and foster care.

Head lice can be a nuisance but they have not been shown to spread disease. Personal hygiene or cleanliness in the home or school has nothing to do with getting head lice. Both the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) and the National Association of School Nurses (NASN) advocate that "no-nit" policies should be discontinued.

...

Children should be discouraged from close head-to-head contact with others. Education staff and Family Advocates follow-up with family to ensure that the infestation is being addressed appropriately until the infestation has ended. PROCEDURES: Prevention. Every classroom will screen children two times per year for head lice.

## **Managing Head Lice (Pediculosis) in School Settings and at ...**

Head lice don't carry bacterial or viral infectious diseases. Over-the-counter and prescription medications are available to treat head lice. Follow treatment instructions carefully to rid your scalp and hair of lice and their eggs.

## **Head lice - Symptoms and causes - Mayo Clinic**

Stray lice that fall off a head are either injured or dying and incapable of causing a new infestation. Although schools, day care centers, etc. are often blamed for head lice outbreaks, it is the family unit that maintains cases leading to outbreaks in schools. Treatment. Both over-the-counter and prescription medications are available for treatment of lice infestations.

## **Head Lice: Department of Health**

Primary responsibility for the control of head lice lies with individuals, families and public health experts. However, schools can assist with controlling and preventing head lice.

Place non-washable personal articles of clothing or bedding in the dryer on high heat for at least 20 minutes, dry clean or seal non-washable fabrics in a plastic bag for a minimum of 10 days. Place combs and brushes in a pan of water and heat on a stove to about 150 degrees F for 10 minutes.

## **Head Lice | IDPH - Illinois**

Direct inspection of hair and scalp is the best way to find adult head lice and their eggs (also called nits). Both are commonly found at the nape of the neck and behind the ears. The school nurse will explain exactly where nits and lice were found on your child's head. Check all family members for signs of head lice.
